



Alexander Morcom MacLean

Alexander Morcom MacLean, 87, passed away peacefully in his sleep on April 25, 2024 in

Pinehurst, North Carolina. He was born in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania to the late Alexander

MacLean & Mary Rolfe MacLean and is predeceased by his wife of 50 years, Yvonne Wood

MacLean; his sister, Linda Harnies; his son, Robert Ellis MacLean; his stepdaughter, Deborah

Anne Bryant; and his first wife, Loella Josephine MacLean.

After serving on the USS Independence and bases on both the east and west coasts, as well as

tours in the Mediterranean and other myriad ports of call, Alexander, known by his crew as

soon hired by National Semiconductor in San Jose, California in the early days of the

computer era. He eventually retired from National Semiconductor and he and his wife made
