She had a close bond to her brother and his family.

Brigitte had a passion for working with children. Her home was often referred to the "Kool-Aid House" because the neighborhood children would gather there. Her love of children lead her to work at Peter Pan Nursery, C. Wayne Collier Elementary School, and the afterschool program at the Hope Mills Recreation Center. She loved country music and she would teach kids how to two-step and the Cotton-Eye Joe dance. George Jones was her favorite singer and his version of "Good Hearted Woman" was her favorite song.
